Sunday 27th October - Saturday 9th November: Dylan Thomas Festival (Dylan Thomas Centre, Swansea)

This year's annual Dylan Thomas Festival will include the launch of a new Dylan Thomas centenary commission from Gillian Clarke, an evening on *The Killing* and a special Fluellen production preview of their new version of *Rebecca's Daughters*. Also during the event Swansea University's John Goodby will be discussing his new critical study of Thomas' poetry. Events take place at The Dylan Thomas Centre, Swansea and the full programme is available through the Centre website.

Thursday 31st October: Gwyn Thomas in the Kingdom of the Chip (Barry Arts Central, Barry)
